The Parent/Carers

I/We will:

- Ensure that my child attends school daily and is on time
- Ensure that my child is properly equipped
- Make use of the school planner to communicate with school
- Follow the communication process for contacting staff
- Support the school's code of conduct and uniform code
- Attend parents' evenings and any additional meetings to discuss my child's progress
- Contact the school if any issues arise concerning my child
- Avoid taking holidays during the school term
- Monitor the use of the internet at home, especially social media sites or apps
- Treat staff with courtesy and respect
